Spring Trip to Belize March 4-10th

We have 24 people going to Belize, and the teams are full.

The dental team, headed by Jean DeShazo Jumet, will be working at Mopan Technical High School in Benque Viejo. Most of the students have never seen a dentist before, so keep the dental team in your prayers! Each student will get their teeth cleaned and fluoride treatment on their molars. The team will do as much restorative work as possible. They hope to see 200 students. There is no dental school in Belize and few dentists, so this is an invaluable ministry.

The eye screening team, headed by Bill and Beth McClell and Robert and Catherine Perrin will be working with Belize Commission for the Visually Impaired to screen 500 students and refract for glasses as needed. The cost of the glasses (including frames) ranges between \$25-\$45 a pair. The International Missionary Society has been fundraising to cover this expense.

Finally the construction team, headed by Brad Telfian, will be doing restorative work at Holy Cross School in Calle Creek.

The team will be commissioned at the Port of Grace (5:00 p.m.) service on February 26th. The whole team so appreciates your support and prayers.
