Madeleine comes with an abundance of formation experience. As a Seminarian at Church of the Holy Family in Chapel Hill and previously at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Cary, she assisted in the planning and leading of children's programming and some preaching. At Duke Seminary, she trained students to become acolytes and how to lead Morning Prayer. In addition to other church experiences, she was the Associate Director for Reunions at Wheaton College where she planned and executed events, including the recruiting and advising of volunteers. She is Certified Godly Play storytelling, participated in the Episcopal Preaching Foundation's Preaching Excellence Program and she also has advanced Spanish writing and speaking skills. These experiences and skills will all translate well into our formation planning and implementation at Grace and Holy Trinity.

Madeleine graduates in May from Duke Divinity School with a Master of Divinity and Certificate in Anglican Studies. She graduated from Wheaton College in Wheaton, IL seven years prior earning a B.S. in Applied Health Science and B.A. in Spanish. A highlight in college for her was a 16-week study abroad program in Querétaro, Mexico. Great students make terrific teachers! As I shared at the Annual Meeting, formation will be a church planning focus in 2025. We sit engulfed in the educational blessing of VCU.
